Jewish Justices of the Supreme Court examines the lives, legal careers, and Jewish legacies of the eight Jews who have served or who currently serve as justices of the U.S. Supreme Court: Louis D. Brandeis, Benjamin Cardozo, Felix Frankfurter, Arthur Goldberg, Abe Fortas, Ruth Bader Ginsburg, Stephen G. Breyer, and Elena Kagan. David Dalin discusses the relationship that these Jewish justices have had with the presidents who appointed them and examines the activism of some of the justices encountered in their ascent within the legal profession before their appointment, as well as the role that activism played in their attendant political debates and Senate confirmation battles.

Dr. David Dalin, an ordained rabbi and widely published scholar of American Jewish history is the author or co-author of 11 books. David Dalin's latest book, *Jewish Justices of the Supreme Court*, from Brandeis to Kagan, is available now from Brandeis University Press. This nationally-acclaimed book was selected as a Finalist for the Jewish Book Council's 2017 National Jewish Book Awards. Dr. David Dalin has taught Jewish studies at several universities and has served as a visiting professor at George Washington University and at the Jewish Theological Seminary.

Dr. Dalin has also served as the Taube Research Fellow in American History at Stanford University. A well-known lecturer, he has been a featured speaker or a scholar-in-residence at universities, synagogues and Jewish communal institutions throughout the United States and in Europe and Israel.

Moral Courage During the Holocaust

IMPLICATIONS TODAY

Dr. Eva Fogelman is a psychologist, author, and filmmaker. She is also a child of Holocaust survivors who was inspired by the courage of ordinary people who risked their lives defying authority to help aid her father during the war. Eva's Pulitzer Prize-nominated book *Conscience and Courage: Rescuers of Jews During the Holocaust* sparked an international movement to examine the moral responsibility to deter genocide.

Currently, Dr. Fogelman advocates for what we can learn from Holocaust rescuers to confront present-day racism. She also does extensive work with child survivors of the Holocaust and descendants of survivors. An informal Q&A with the keynote speaker will follow the program. Kosher refreshments will be served.

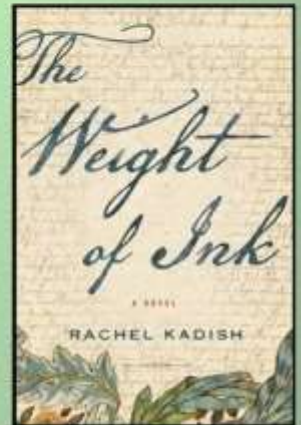
